WQP Future Charging Policy

Following on from the letter which was distributed in September 2009 to all members, Warwickshire Quality Partnership are writing to inform all providers that from 1st May 2010 WQP will be **charging for training programmes**. This is due to a change in the funding streams which were previously available to WQP, with funding now bid for through the Area Based Grants.

Please read the **attached letter** which details how this will be delivered and a copy of the **fax back form** which needs to be completed by ALL providers.

WQP are also asking for a **training needs analysis** to be completed and returned by the **30.04.2010** in order that we can bid for funding based on real demand - This is attached.

If you are sending in more than one application form for a training programme please can you prioritise candidates (1 as the highest etc) on the forms. This is useful if the programme becomes oversubscribed.
